## Baraboo Walnut Hill Cemetery Association Rules and Regulations

1. Cemetery hours: Summer—April 1 to November 1, 7:00 am to 9:00 pm  
Winter—November 1 to April 1, 7:00 am to 5:00 pm
2. From May 1 thru November 1 only real flowers and grave marker are allowed. From November 1 thru May 1 only artificial flowers, wreath, and grave marker are allowed in the cemetery all other objects will be removed and disposed of.
3. No dogs or other pets allowed on the grounds except seeing eye dogs.
4. All gravesites must face east and west.
5. The Cemetery states the size and placement of the marker. Only one marker per gravesite.
6. Field stones may be used as markers if they are cut, polished, approved size, and approved by the board with written permission.
7. All funerals entering the cemetery shall be under the supervision of the Cemetery management.
8. All burials must have an interment permit filled out by the person in charge of the funeral before any burial is completed.
9. The Cemetery Association reserves and shall have the right to correct any errors that may be made by it; either in making interments, disinterments, removals, or in the description, transfer, conveyance or substituting in lieu thereof other property of like or equal value so far as be possible.
10. Only one full body or four cremations or a mother and her infant of one year or less are permitted on one regular gravesite.
11. Planting of flowers around the marker is a privilege for now which can end at any time. You may plant flowers up to one foot out from the cement monument foundation but *the Cemetery is not responsible in any way for damage done to flowers or bushes during normal maintenance or digging of graves. The Cemetery is not responsible for any stolen items. No mulch or edging of any kind is allowed. No planting of any kind of bushes.*
12. Any bushes, shrubs, trees, or flowers that interfere with the normal maintenance, digging of graves, or detract from the cemetery “in the board’s opinion” shall be removed and not replaced.
13. Perpetual care “P.C.” is that care and maintenance necessitated by natural growth and ordinary wear which can be provided at reasonable intervals with income from the P.C. Fund and including the care of lawns, trees, and shrubs; the cleaning and upkeep of buildings, roads, walkways, walls, and utilities as in its sound discretion shall deem to be the best interests of the cemetery.
